

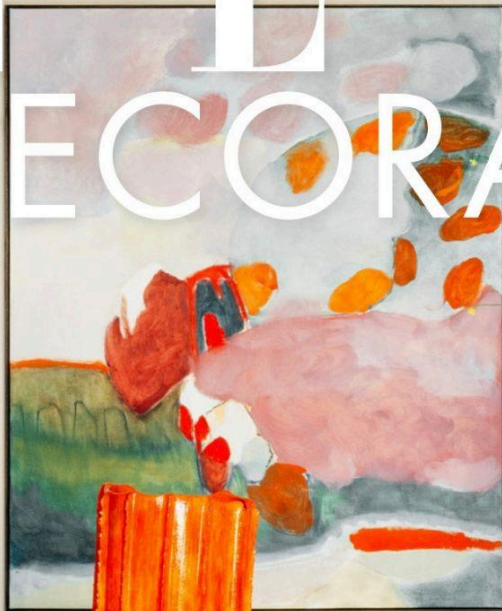

# Milan design week



## 'Lanai' bed, Poliform

We've been documenting the changing bedroom-furniture landscape for some time, spurred on by the rise of immersive bed installations. With 'Lanai', Yabu Pushelberg responds to this shift, recognising that the bedroom is no longer reserved for rest alone. Celebrating the fact that it functions as a space to inhabit throughout the day, this design incorporates adaptable elements, integrated shelving, layered cushions and flexible surfaces, to support everything from reading and working to lounging (poliform.it).



## 'Insulator' table lamp, Novocastrian

For its debut exhibition at Alcova, this collective of designers and craftspeople presented a lighting range informed by one of Britain's most prized inventions: the railway. They shone a light specifically on the glass-pin insulators suspended above the UK's railway tracks, a feat of engineering from the industrial revolution. Handcrafted in northern England, the collection includes table lamps and pendants in three finishes, each featuring ribbed glass that casts dynamic patterns of light (novocastrian.co).



## The Gallery, RH

Following the opening of its Paris gallery (and with the London one coming soon), American furniture brand RH is continuing its European takeover with its first Italian destination. Bravo! Set within a monumental restored neoclassical palace on Corso Venezia, the seven-level space was a destination during design week, and will continue to be one once the crowds leave. Alongside RH's interiors and outdoor collections, shoppers can preview RH Estates, a concept showcasing partnerships with industry icons, such as Anouska Hempel and Richard Hallberg (rh.com).



## 'Belt' sofa, Turri

The clue is in the name with this sofa, which has a leather belt (finished by a buckle engraved with the brand's distinctive "T" monogram, no less) that wraps around the armrests in a tight embrace. The design by Matteo Nunziati features a range of premium textiles for upholstery (turri.it). ➤
