In the heart of Milan

We start in the city center: between San Babila, Via Durini, and Corso Monforte. From Palazzo Bovara, reimagined by Piero Lissoni for Elle Decor Italia, to Edra's elegant residence on the main floor of Palazzo Durini, all the way to Poliform's new opening, with its three floors in Piazza della Scala and the outdoor space at Palazzo Clerici. Then there are historic brands, such as Cassina, and the big names in lighting: Artemide, Flos, Foscarini, FontanaArte—which is inaugurating its space designed by Franco Raggi—and Nemo Lighting, with its new showroom on Via Santa Cecilia, designed by Ron Gilad.

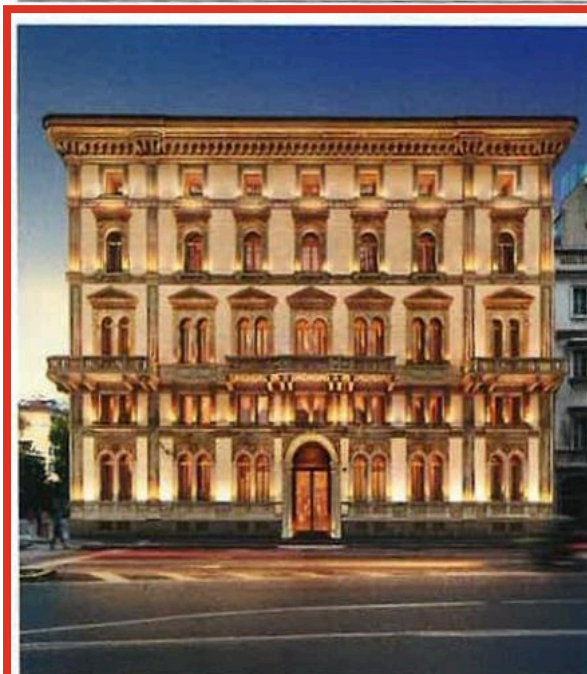


IN THE VISIONARY WORLD OF FORNASETTI

Classic and modern, decorative and radical. We can't resist Fornasetti. Forever Fornasetti. New Encounters marks a new chapter with the restyling of the Corso Venezia store designed by Tutto Bene Studio (see page 180 for the feature on their pied-à-terre in Milan). For three months, the space will host Fornasetti Fiori by Fjura, curated by Simone Gooch. Also coming soon are the new collections and the collaboration with cc-tapis, which translates Fornasetti's iconography into rugs crafted using artisanal techniques and natural materials. Sizes range from monumental pieces to small tapestries designed as collectibles, featuring archival motifs such as Re Sole and Peccato Originale from the 1950s alongside the playful Gattipanni. Zanotta between Mollino and new visions

The Zanotta flagship store has been revamped by art directors Calvi Brambilla: coffee-colored plaster and vinyl curtains interact with wallpaper inspired by the Quaderna series. Among the new names: Studiopepe, Monica Armani, and Simone Bonanni. Then there's news that design lovers will appreciate: through a public tender, Zanotta has obtained an exclusive license from the Italian government to produce thirty works by Carlo Mollino. A move that brings some of the Turin architect's most visionary projects back into production, starting with the reissue of the Vertebra table. Via Durini 25/27



RH arrives in Milan

A seven-story neoclassical building and the entry of a new brand into the Italian market: impossible not to stop by. RH Milan, the first Italian gallery of the North American luxury furniture brand, occupies 7,000 square meters of space dedicated to retail and hospitality. The tour takes visitors through domestic settings and collections of furnishings for the home and outdoors, flanked by a studio dedicated to design consulting. Rounding out the experience is the spectacular double-height dining room of La Volta restaurant, seating 178, dominated by Fabio Viale's sculptural installation Amore&Psiche. Corso Venezia 56
