

CARE INSTRUCTIONS FOR DINING TABLES



RECLAIMED RUSSIAN OAK TABLES

- Use coasters or placemats to help prevent marks or stains.
- Do not place hot items directly on the tabletop.
- Wipe the table clean with a soft, dry cloth after each use.
- The occasional application of a high-quality clear furniture wax will help protect the finish from minor spills. Please note that slight variations in color and an incomplete seal may occur with any sealant; test on an inconspicuous area first.



SALVAGED WOOD TABLES

NATURAL FINISH:

- Use coasters or placemats to help prevent marks and stains.
- Wipe wood with a slightly damp cloth; note that a small amount of the finish may transfer to the cloth. Always clean entire tabletop to maintain uniform finish.
- Mop up spills with a dry cloth.
- Stains may be removed by lightly sanding with 320-grit sandpaper.
- The occasional application of a high-quality clear furniture wax will help protect the finish from minor spills. Please note that slight variations in color and an incomplete seal may occur with any sealant; test on an inconspicuous area first.

BROWN, BLACK OR GREY FINISH:

- Use coasters or placemats to help prevent marks and stains.
- Wipe wood with a soft, dry cloth; mop up spills with a wet cloth. Always clean entire tabletop to maintain uniform finish.

SIDEBOARDS WITH GLASS DOORS:

- Wipe glass using a damp cloth with mild soap and water, followed by a dry cloth.



FINE VENEER TABLETOPS

- Use coasters or placemats to help prevent marks or stains.
- Do not place hot items directly on the tabletop.
- Wipe the table clean with a soft, dry cloth after each use.



UNSEALED RECLAIMED WOOD TABLES

- Use coasters or placemats to help prevent marks or stains.
- Do not place hot items directly on the tabletop.
- Wipe up spills quickly with a clean cloth.



SEALED RECLAIMED WOOD TABLES

- Use coasters or placemats to help prevent marks or stains.
- Do not place hot items directly on the tabletop.
- Wipe the table clean with a soft, dry cloth after each use.
- The occasional application of a high-quality clear furniture wax will help protect the finish from minor spills. Please note that slight variations in color and an incomplete seal may occur with any sealant; test on an inconspicuous area first.



SOLID HARDWOOD TABLES

- Use coasters or placemats to help prevent marks or stains.
- Do not place hot items directly on the tabletop.
- Wipe the table clean with a soft, dry cloth after each use.
- The occasional application of a high-quality clear furniture wax will help protect the finish from minor spills. Please note that slight variations in color and an incomplete seal may occur with any sealant; test on an inconspicuous area first.



METAL TABLETOPS

- Use coasters or placemats to help prevent marks or stains.
- Wipe up spills quickly with a clean cloth.
- Do not place hot items directly on the tabletop.
- Metal surfaces scratch easily; do not cut directly on the surface.



BLUESTONE TABLETOPS

- Wipe up spills immediately with a soft, dry cloth.
- Do not place hot items directly on the tabletop.
- Bluestone tabletops will scratch and are not heat or food safe. Avoid sharp objects, and do not place hot items or food directly on surface. We recommend the use of coasters, trivets and placemats.



CONCRETE TABLETOPS

- Clean up spills as soon as possible.
- Use coasters or placemats to help prevent marks or stains.
- Do not cut directly on concrete top to avoid damaging the sealer.
- Always use a cutting board when preparing food.
- Avoid placing hot items directly on the concrete top. Concrete is heat resistant, but excessive heat can damage or discolor the sealer.
- Avoid abrasive soaps or cleansers. A mild soap and warm water is recommended for daily cleaning.
- When a heavier cleaning is needed, use a cleaner that is PH neutral. Avoid products containing bleach or ammonia.
- Apply a high-quality furniture wax every 2 to 3 months to the surface of the concrete top.



WEATHERED CONCRETE TABLETOPS

- Clean up spills as soon as possible.
- Use coasters or placemats to help prevent marks or stains.
- Do not cut directly on concrete top to avoid damaging the sealer.
- Always use a cutting board when preparing food.
- Avoid placing hot items directly on the concrete top. Concrete is heat resistant, but excessive heat can damage or discolor the sealer.
- Avoid abrasive soaps or cleansers. A mild soap and warm water is recommended for daily cleaning.
- When a heavier cleaning is needed, use a cleaner that is PH neutral. Avoid products containing bleach or ammonia.
- Apply a high-quality furniture wax every 2 to 3 months to the surface of the concrete top.



MARBLE TABLETOPS

- Marble tabletop is porous and can easily be stained, scratched or chipped.
- Protect from acidic substances like wine, coffee, fruit juice and tomato sauce. Always blot spills immediately and rinse with a clean, damp cloth.
- Do not place hot items directly on the tabletop.
- Do not use chemical cleansers, dusting sprays, abrasive cleaners or furniture polish.
- To prevent ring marks, place coasters or trivets under glasses and dishes; use mats or runners beneath hard objects that might scratch the surface.
- Dust frequently with a clean, soft cloth. Wash periodically with a cloth dampened with warm water, and if necessary, a small amount of mild dishwashing liquid. Use a second damp cloth to remove the soap.



WAXED TABLETOPS

- Use coasters or placemats to help prevent marks or stains. Avoid mineral oil, as its usage could discolor the wood.
- Do not place hot items directly on the tabletop.
- Wipe the table clean with a soft, dry cloth after each use.
- Wax can be reapplied, as normal use wears away the waxed finish. Use a high-quality furniture wax. Please note that slight variations in color and an incomplete seal may occur with any sealant; test on an inconspicuous area first.



GLASS TABLETOPS

- Do not place hot items directly on the tabletop.
- Clean tabletop with glass cleaner.
