








Prints and the Revolution

WHEN PORTIA DE ROSSI landed her first big acting role, she immediately bought a Rita Ackermann drawing. It was the first significant acquisition for the now-sizable collection—ranging from Picasso to Basquiat—that she shares with her wife, Ellen DeGeneres. "I'm fascinated by how art provides questions rather than commentary," says de Rossi. No doubt her passion helped convince the

furnishings and lifestyle brand Restoration Hardware to partner with de Rossi's new company, General Public, which uses a technology called Synograph to make 3D prints that replicate paintings in both look and texture. "What makes paintings valuable to me is the fact that it's good, not the fact that it's scarce or rare," says de Rossi, whose team of art advisers evaluates submissions from

painters around the world. Among the four artists selected to create a total of 49 works for General Public's exclusive collection with RH is Amsterdam-based Paul van Rij, who paints on salvaged pieces of wood, metal, and stone. Says de Rossi: "I just thought, There's a better way than the antiquated gallery system to introduce talented artists to more people." From \$895; rh.com.
